Program Explores Panama Canal

"Canal Zone," the newest documentary produced, directed and edited by Emmy Award-winner Frederick Wiseman will air on Connecticut Public Television on Friday, October 7 at 9:00 pm. The film will be repeated on Sunday, October 9 at 2:00 pm.

Filmed in the ten by fifty-mile strip of Central America which the United States has owned, operated and controlled for more than sixty years, Canal Zone is the eleventh in Wiseman's series of documentaries on the operation of American institutions.

Beginning with a trip through the Canal aboard a Japanese freighter laden with automobiles bound for Europe, Canal Zone focuses on the daily life of the American residents—a scenario played out against the background of the treaty negotiations between the United States and Panama.

The film examines how the zone is governed and how the canal is operated. Wiseman looks at community meetings, schools, commissaries, and hospitals.

Council To Hold Ethnic Festival

The Fifth Annual Mayor's All Americans Festival, sponsored by the Mayor's All Americans Council, will be held from Monday, October 10 through Saturday, October 15, in the G. Fox & Company's Centinel Hill Hall. As in past years, more than sixty of Hartford's ethnic groups will present dances, cooking, music and other aspects of their cultural heritages to visitors of all ages and backgrounds.

This year's Festival will feature for the first time, the inclusion of native Americans in the rich ethnic pageant, and will also feature representatives of Cuban residents of this area who will share the culture of that island nation with their Hartford neighbors.

The Festival was one of the first projects adopted by the Mayor's All Americans Council when that group was formed by Mayor Athanson in 1972. Each year, hundreds of school children visit the Festival as part of school outings arranged to introduce the youngsters to the ethnic and cultural diversity of urban life.

School Offers College Sampler

Hartford College for Women has begun a new series of adult study programs that will be offered to area residents beginning in October. Known as College Sampler, the new programs are inexpensive, relatively short in length and designed to satisfy the wide range of interests of today's men and women. Prices range from \$7 to \$75 per program.

College Sampler programs range in length from a single session to a maximum of nine. There will be both daytime and evening courses taught by faculty from Hartford College for Women and other area colleges and universities. All programs will be held on the Hartford College for Women campus at Asylum Avenue and Elizabeth Street, Hartford, CT.

Program topics range from 'Botany for Gardeners', to 'Women and Work', an exploration of how contemporary women combine the roles of wage earner and housewife.

The mid-life crisis when one is thrust into the role of caring for elderly parents is the subject of 'Being A Parent To Parents'. 'German for Travelers' will be under the leadership of Hartford College for Women Professor Renate Seitz. Other topics include 'Man, Woman and Child', by well known local author and Hartford College for Women Professor Oliver Butterworth, 'The Early Connecticut House', 'You, The Sea and Tomorrow', and 'The Jewish People in an Age of Ideology'.
